I. Introduction

The report of Vimukti Charitable Trust (VCT) for the year 2012-13 can be begun by quoting these few lines of the great poet John Wesley. The logo stands out in triumphant ‘**Come Let’s bring a change**’, it’s the motto that radiates the ray of hope, Joy and happiness in the lives of people who are still battling and struggling for a comfortable living and much more, the attention is centered around the welfare and the growth of the children who have been neglected and are given hardly any opportunities to make a difference in the society.

Vimukti, Pothnal with the support of “ENSEMBLE AGGISSONS- FRANCE” (**Come let’s bring a change**) made sincere efforts to bring to unearthen and nurture the hidden resources of Marginalized children through various strategic interventions. Here is a glance on the various activities conducted during the year.

II. Child welfare project

1. **Inauguration of “Convergence for Child Survival and Development (CCSD)”** : It was a momentous event that thrilled the hearts of one and all, as they witnessed the amazing juxtaposition of VCT’s credentials and widening of its avenues. VCT got into hands and gloves with the government officials. This convergence for child Survival and Development was indeed a great milestone that would make Vimukti to be well anchored and sustain its energies while facing the various social challenges and problems.

Vimukti hosted a one day program, in order to discuss and resolve the problems and difficulties faced by the preliminary schools (anganwadis), Nearly 40 District Government officials were brought on one platform to discuss this on a one-day session. On 20th April 2012 the program based on the development of children was inaugurated by Respectable Mr. Manoj Jain CEO, Zilla Panchayat Raichur. More than 400 children were present for the inaugural function, which was held in the Vimukti Premises at Pothnal. The Program was based and focused on empowering the rural children in every possible way.

Vimukti was entrusted with the responsibility to survey the various preliminary schools in the vicinity of Manvi taluka and make a critical study of the structures and functioning of Anganwadis, lower & Higher Primary Schools, Health Sub Center/Primary Sub Centers in the Villages.

2. **Orientation Training to GP Coordinators** : Vimukti Pothnal organized one day first hand informative training program at Vimukti Premises. This training was intended to motivate and to make a base line survey to know the present scenario, of health, nutrition and education of the villages (Socio-economy) more effective. All the 36 GP Coordinators were present for this training. All GP Coordinators were given a survey format which includes information of infrastructure and service gaps at different levels in villages – specially concentrating on AWCs, PHCs, Schools, and villages. The Training was well appreciated and thus ended on a positive note.

3. **G.P Coordinators Welfare Programme** : The key persons in the realization of the various programs were the staff who work for the development of Children and deal with the social issues. In fact, the entire success of the project undertaken depends on their dedicated work. When the Project was started most of the staff were new and were inexperienced in Social Developmental Field. We had to organize a two-day training program for the GP Coordination's who were working for the same cause. The staff underwent Orientation and Capacity Building Training, which was an asset for them. In turn, they were able and fit to animate the community and organize the people.
4. **Inauguration of Mobile Computer Training:** On 2nd of May 2012 at 3.00 pm, inauguration program of computer course was done at Vimukti Charitable Trust Pothnal. The main aim and goal of this programme is precisely meant for poor children in and around Pothnal area. In the modern society there is great demand for the professionals and skilled men and women and to meet this existing demand of the society, the computer education course is a great help. It would also help many to benefit and live a self-reliant life.
5. **Afforestation Campaign:** A tree is, perhaps, the most valuable gift provided by Mother Nature. It gives what is required for living human life: wood, shade, fruits and oxygen. In cutting down trees, humans fail to see their purpose and by destroying trees they destroy the land itself. The hope of Afforestation was enkindled this year when the entire Raichur received good showers of rain. A campaign was organized at Utaknoor High school of Raichur district by the Vimukti Charitable Trust to create awareness against the growing practice of cutting down trees instead of preserving trees. Raichur being an area that often faces scarcity of rain is prone to face extinction of trees. Besides, people cut trees for firewood. The whole gathering received information with regard to the usefulness of planting trees and protecting the environment. The President emphasized in his speech: "take care of the earth and she will take care of you"

Many then participated in the event of planting of trees. The people and the children were enlightened and were given the responsibility of taking care of those plants by watering them time to time and looking after them well. Many plants were planted in the surroundings of the Utakanur High school. There were nearly 320 beneficiaries who benefited from this program.
6. **Awareness to Pregnant and Post Natal Mothers in 36 Gram Panchayaths** : On July 20th 2012 Vimukti Charitable Trust Pothnal organized one day awareness programme to all the Pregnant Women and Post Natal Mothers in 36 *Grma Panchayaths*. Held in different places of Manvi Taluka, the purpose of the programme was to motivate and to make known the importance of motherhood and how to take

care of the new-born child. In 36 *Grama Pnachayaths* various resource persons were invited to give input sessions. Basically they informed the role and duties during pregnancy and postnatal period. They discussed, how to take care of their own health and hygiene and what kind of food to be given to the child, how to improve its health and hygienic as well; what is the importance of 100% institutional deliveries, how to take care of the child, to overcome superstitions and blind beliefs with regard to breast feeding etc.

Awareness Programmes about child care to the mothers (The Nutritious food provided by the government) also included information regarding the way to avail government benefits at the proper time specially delivery Kit, delivery care, delivery benefits and maternity benefits. Many other related issues were discussed and guidelines were given in order to improve health in given circumstances. Nearly 3500 pregnant women and Post Natal Mothers benefited from this awareness programme.

7. **Training for Adolescent Girls in the 22 Grama Panchayaths in Manvi Taluka** : On August 12th 2012 Vimukti Charitable Trust Pothnal organized this programme to all the adolescent girls in 22 *Grama Panchayaths*. The training was held in different places of Manvi Taluka. In 22 *Grama Pnachayaths* various resource persons were identified and invited to give input sessions. There was very good discussion between the participants and resource persons. The participants raised many doubts and their daily problems which were aptly answered. All the participants were happy and satisfied with the informative sessions. Nearly 1840 beneficiaries profited from the programme and expressed that they were ignorant about these things and were happy to be part of. Improving and living a healthy life in the given circumstances
8. **Training for (SDMC) Members in 36 GP in Manvi Taluka** : On September 29th 2012 it organized one day training programmes to all the SDMC members in 36 *Grama Panchayaths*. The training was held in different places of Manvi Taluka. The Training was organized in order to motivate and to make known the responsibility and how to take care of the child. In 36 *Grama Panachyaths* various resource persons in their input sessions informed that the Government has evolved the system of having a School Development and Monitoring Committee for each of the Government schools in order to ensure community ownership and community participation in education. The SDMC has been given necessary powers for ensuring that the schools are managed better and most of the issues relating to the academic aspects and developmental activities of the schools are addressed by them. The Head Master of the school functions as the Secretary of the SDMC. These and many other related issues were discussed in the training. There were nearly 1455 beneficiaries who profited from this training.

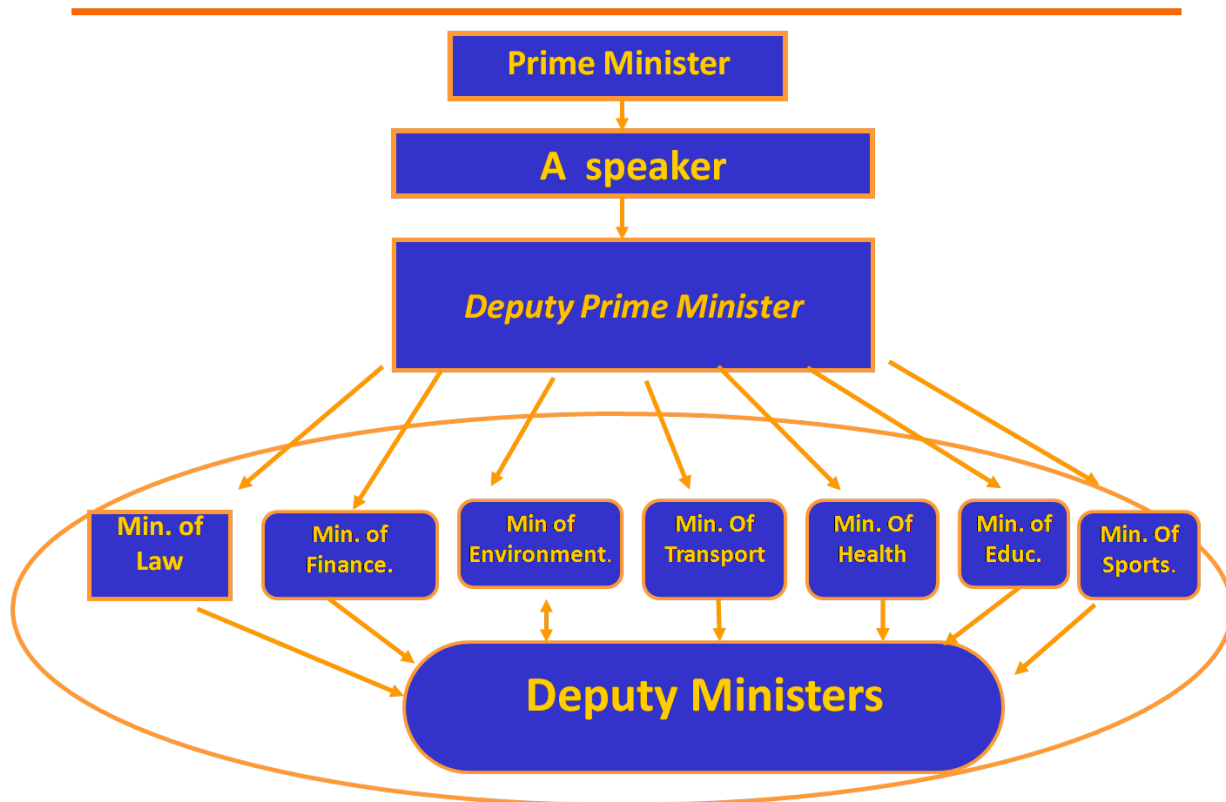
9. **Summer Camp** : Three days summer camp was organized at Vimukti premises by VCT for the Club children from 17th to 19th of October, 2012 for their holistic development. 310 children attended it. They are enriched with the wide knowledge and gained rich experience of learning innovative things through digital learning. The main purpose behind the camp was to develop and nurture the young minds rationally.
10. **Medical Camp** : On 20th of October, 2012, a Medical camp was organized at Vimukti. There were 750 children. There were 2 doctors and nurses examined the children. A play on Health and Hygiene was performed by the staff. Children were asked to maintain cleanliness in and around the living habitation as part of their health awareness program. The health camp recorded on height and weight, Blood pressure and general health indications. After the program nearly 38 children were referred to different hospitals for further treatments.
11. **Vimukti Blood Bank** : The Training on *Vimukti* Blood Bank was inaugurated on 25th of October 12, 2012. This training was held at Vimukti premises. The training was also meant for creating awareness in villages on the importance of voluntary Blood donation. '**Give Blood-save life**' has been the motto of Vimukti. At the end of the program, names of those ready to donate blood were taken. There were nearly 185 beneficiaries benefited from this training.
12. **Children's Day Celebration** November 14th 2012 is a special day for all the children in India. This year *Kanakadasa Jayanthi* took its place and it was declared as a public holiday all over Karnataka. The Vimukti Charitable Trust took every care to celebrate it. Mr. Dhipak Boosa Reddy, the Police Sub inspector of Manvi presided over the function. In his speech he explained that the Children's Day is to be celebrated as "childhood day", to pay tribute to all the children all over the world. They are loved by all. They win over hearts with their angelic eyes and innocent smiles. It makes one realize, 'maybe that's the way God want us to be'. They are the wealth of the nation. They are the future leaders, scientists and teachers of the nation. Children's Day is a day for children to engage in fun and frolic. Nearly 940 children participated and benefited from this Program
13. **A New Trend- Child Parliament** VCT is progressing day by day and here we would like to share something very special as it laid foundation to form a new drift "**children's parliament**". It is for the first time introduced in the area of Pothnal. VCT has formed Children's Parliament in 14 villages. Looking deeply of its benefits for the children this pace would work successfully. After all the most beneficiaries would be none other than the children themselves. They can bring changes in their lives, in their surroundings and in the society at large.

14. Vimukti Children's Parliament Mission : To obtain accurate evolution on the scope, nature and impact of Children's parliament to Build, self esteem and self confidence for all children to be used in developing future legislative and programmatic interventions.

Objectives

- ❁ To give independent voice for Child
- ❁ To develop leadership qualities at the tender age.
- ❁ To create awareness on their rights
- ❁ To improve their civic sense
- ❁ Improving their communication and negotiation skills.

15. New Children's Parliament Units : The initiation of the children into this parliament unit brings new vistas to look and hope for, as these children would indeed make a drastic change in the face of rising problems and difficulties. There is of course a wider room for the steady growth and development in the various fields of socio-economic domain and we can surely vouch for bringing in the change through the establishment of the children's parliament program. Keeping this in mind, VCT formed new children's parliament units in 11 villages in our working area.

16. Training on Children's Parliament : The training was held at vimukti premises which served as a platform for the children to develop leadership skills, confidence, team spirit, analytical skills and maturity. This training program was aimed at making the children aware of the powers of a parliamentary democracy. They would know how to be a responsible citizen and the importance of involving themselves in community affairs.

The resource persons with their inputs shared that the Children could learn about the democratic processes, the right to vote, the law and the power of a fair ballot. In the coming years, they would also be educated on topics such as deficiency of nutrients in children, lack of safety in school buildings, transport-related problems, and rehabilitation of children in the context of Act to prevent Child Labour, Child Marriage etc.

17. Parliament at the Grassroots (Bus Facility) : No doubt a Children's Parliament is a strong force it has succeeded in getting what they wanted. Here we would like to bring to your notice its first achievement in the Pothnal area. In many of the villages in and around Pothnal, lack the proper transport facilities. People and especially the children are the most victims of this. Nalgamdinni, Iralagaddi, Utakanur, Karabadinni, Devipura, Muddanguddi, these village children face transport facilities and due to which, many a time they have to bunk the school and college. During peak hours in the morning as well as in the evening there is hardly any bus facility in these areas. That is why this Children's Parliament approached the Taluka transport department, with its strong urge to do something concretely in time. For their pleading the unit head Mr .J. T. Choudari promised them to provide transport facility from December 21, 2012. The Children's Parliament members warned them if they fail to fulfill their need, they will counter the head of transport ministry by way of protest.

18. A Plead Towards The Fulfillment Of Basic Amenities In Markamdhinni Village : In the recent times health has played a vital role in facilitating the growth and the development of the society. A serene life is possible if only the living conditions are better taken care off. Many a times due to the lack of favorable and suitable living conditions the human life is deteriorated and humanity is at a loss. So it

is very important to note that the fundamental human requirements are to be fulfilled at any cost. The pure drinking water is one of the basic amenities everywhere and in every way. There are lots of diseases occur due to impure consuming of water. In our targeted villages like Utaknur, Dotharbandi, Takkal, Belavata, Sunkanur are the most affected areas which do not have proper basic amenities. Keeping this in mind the Vimukti organization led the Children's Parliament to submit a note to P.D.O of the *Gram Panchayat*. This note included in detail –how the people from their area were affected due to the consumption of polluted water. The water is also stagnated around the roads and even the sides are so polluted with dirty water; sad to say that there are no drains to let the water out and make the road or even the area free-from- stagnant water problems.

19. Visit to Police Statio: We know that in the past the Vimukti ceaselessly working towards the development and education of children in various ways and tries to implement new ways and methods, it organized a day out for about 148 children to the Kavital police working department to know more about the work and mission that is undertaken by the police personnel. In many countries around the world police are often the main violators of rights - especially in relation to children. However, through this training and sensitization police assured them as they would become the partners and protectors of children's rights. These children were introduced to various materials and information about who the police are and the duties they shoulder.

20. Momentous Event : January 8th, 2012 would remain a significant day in the hearts and minds of the Vimukti children as their long awaited dream was fulfilled and the long planned, *Vimukti Makkala Hejje* (the foot prints of Vimukti children) the magazine was released.

The Vimukti institute has always considered working for the betterment of children, striving to bring the best out of them by way of constant moral support; its intention is to see that the children become the little stars and shine wherever they go. This magazine gives ample opportunities to the children to write various articles, poems, rhymes, stories, draw pictures etc. for publication. Nearly 1200 children benefited from this program.

Ongoing program

21. Networking with Other Organizations : Just as the famous saying goes, 'no man is an island', so too, no network can function effectively without the richness of experience that comes from collaborations with other similar-minded entities, These partnerships bring in different perspectives, innovative ideas and new friends. Vimukti has always believed in this principle. Therefore, the network has reached out by initiating visits to other organizations to learn more about their work, to find new avenues for collaboration and open up opportunities for its network members to learn, share and participate in these partnerships.

22. Media Recognition : The vimukti news was given wide coverage in media. The newspapers, like Vijayakarnataka, Sayuntha Karnataka, Suddimula and Sanjavani, Prajavani, and Vijaya Vani. All appreciated the new venture as a very good way of empowering children in democracy participation and know their rights. We are very happy and satisfied that this innovative programme was a great success. This will surely enhance the participation and make known to the children the great benefits of this children's unit towards better social functioning.

23. Greater the unity better the results, The media coverage has really backed us up in carrying our message to a wider section of the society and makes our work more efficient and vigorous by getting more help and support from the people who can support this children's unit.

24. Vocational Training centers

- **Computer Training :** In this competing world of technology and computers, our students are found to cope up with the situation to compete with the world to as to earn their livelihood. The course of DTP has brought smile on their desperate faces.
- **Tailoring Units :** In order to provide alternative income for the young girls 6 months training in cutting and stitching is organized in villages. This year 55 girls are being trained. This is a good program for girls who had no opportunity for perusing higher education. Few girls who are trained have purchased tailoring machine and are employed.

25. Child resource center : Project provided opportunities to the children of rural areas to nurture their talents through child resource center. Children learn computer, typewriting, and play indoor and outdoor games on Saturday and Sunday

26. Formation and Strengthening of Children clubs One of the main programs of child friendly project is formation of children clubs. In all our 16 villages we have children clubs functioning fortnightly. Five animators are handling the project helping out the children in clubs and other child related programs in schools and community. The main aim is to tap children potentialities and capabilities in accordance to their talents and thereby builds up their capacities and ability to take initiative. Children lack basic guidance and direction every child needs in order to have a wholesome growth (i.e. personality, education, general knowledge, cleanliness, creativities and the like). So the project tries to guide the children for a successful future through Saturday clubs. Above 4 grade students participate in these clubs. Through this children will be more vibrant in their school studies and activities and a sound rapport is built up between the project and the children. Altogether there are 1300 children in the clubs.

- 27. Formation of clubs and Parliaments/intervention in new area.** During the reporting period Project formed the clubs and Parliaments in new areas viz Pothnal, Mudhamagudi, Karabhadhinni, Devipura,
- 28. Clubs Representative Meetings** were held once in six months to plan for the strengthening of their clubs at cluster level.
- 29. Regional club meetings.** Once in four months regional club meetings are conducted to discuss about their progress and problems at regional level. So far we have 4 regional clubs in 16 villages.
- 30. Sneha Jyothi Hostel :** Vimukti Charitable Trust conducts a Hostel for boys with 42 students on the roll. Its main purpose is to see to the education of poor boys unable to travel daily to the school from their respective villages. It may be said to be one of the most humanitarian work done by Vimukti as it provides not only board and lodge but also looks after the all round formation of the boys in the Sneha Jyothi Boarding. The intention is to see that the various needs of the children are met and they are enabled to bloom and prosper in future. The VCT as well helps these budding children to cope up with their education and academically produce better results. It makes use of the opportunity to shape these children as future leaders and role models; by instilling into them good values, making them realize the importance of self-discipline and urging them to make a difference in the society. The things have been looking quite positive despite the lack of finance at times; the children are seen to climb higher, grow tougher and to be successful achievers.
- 31. Remedial Teaching (Tuition Classes):** VCT considers the task of children's education as the primary and fundamental task, considering the fact that number of illiterate children is soaring high, as good many children are forced to work in fields due to one or other reason. If timely attention is not given to them their future could be jeopardized. Therefore VCT has thought of providing tuitions to children in 14 Villages, taking into account as well the right to Education. The intention is no other than helping the students to make their future bright and prosperous. VCT has appointed new Remedial teachers in 16 villages and has been now targeting to eliminate child-labour and prioritize the need of education.
- 32. Community mobilizers :** We have 7 community mobilizers among whom one is working in the office and two are residents in our campus. A canteen is put up to cater for the students. One worker is fully engaged for this purpose.

33. Staff monthly meetings are held regular bases once a month to evaluate and to discuss about the programs and plans for the next month

34. Activities and achievements of Children's parliaments in Potnal

- ↳ In Utakanoor village, Children's Parliament leaders found out a dropout child who is very much interested in continuing her studies. The members of the Parliament spoke with the family members and motivated her parents to send her to the school.
- ↳ **Distribution of books to the club children:** School note books were distributed to the club children. There were 795 children that benefited from this scheme. VCT took the initiative to distribute the note books to the poor children of the children's clubs. All the children of the children's clubs benefited from this program.
- ↳ **Campaign on compulsory enrollment:** The Project staffs surveyed the dropout children and found 31 dropout children in the community. Follow up is done to readmit them to the school.
- ↳ Utakanoor village Children's Parliament took a lot of effort to clean the street and the people appreciated them.
- ↳ From Dootharabaddi village, one differently abled child from below poverty line was sent to school after speaking to her parents and the School Headmaster.
- ↳ Six early marriages were prevented in Manvi Taluka (Haravi & Balatage) and the girls were sent to tailoring class.
- ↳ In Mudamaggudi from Children's Parliament a group of children gathered and cleaned the village.
- ↳ In Devipur children along with local women cleaned their school campus.
- ↳ In Belawata Children's Parliament leaders cleaned the drainage near drinking water tap.
- ↳ We, the child parliamentarians, have made a resolution that by the end of this year, no child labourer will be here in our village. We are very happy by starting the Children's Parliament.
- ↳ In Mudamaggudi from Children's Parliament a group of children demanded the local panchayatha to get their benefits which they have received from the Government.
- ↳ Utakanoor Children's Parliament member went to Panchayath demanded to open the village library which was closed for one and half year and it was opened to the public.

- ☞ In Markamdhinni village, Children's Parliament leaders found out a dropout child who is very much interested in continuing her studies. The members of the Parliament spoke with the family members and motivated her parents to send her to the school.
- ☞ The Children's Parliament members from Markamdhinni village, took lot effort cleaned the street and their school campus the people appreciated them.

35. Outcome

- ❖ 10 Children's Parliament were formed which consists of 250 children as members.
- ❖ Children's Parliaments are actively functioning at this juncture.
- ❖ Children discuss various issues in the parliament and take appropriate solutions to attend to the immediate needs of their areas.

36. Future Focus

- ❖ 20 more Children's Parliament will be formed by the end of 2013 in our working areas.
- ❖ Formed Children's Parliament will be given follow up trainings
- ❖ The development of villages through Children's Parliament.
- ❖ Networking with Government ministry of children and with other NGOS.
- ❖ The staff will visit the selected schools and the villages in their respective area and create awareness to the children on the importance of children's parliament for their own development.
- ❖ District convention on Children's Parliament by 2013
- ❖ State Convention on Children's Parliament by 2014.

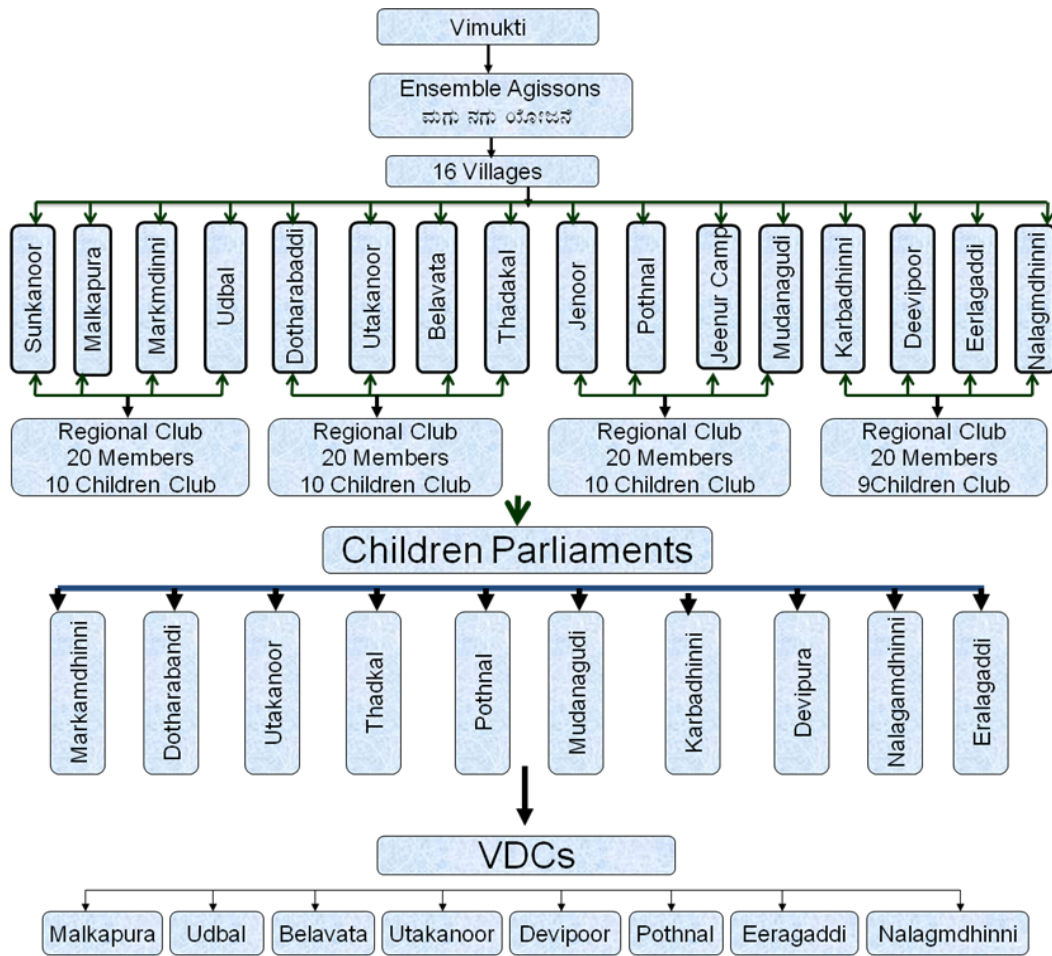
